Special Meeting Summary

23 April 2023 In Person and Virtual

On Sunday, April 23 2023 a Special Congregational Meeting was conducted in person and using the electronic meeting platform Zoom. The business before the congregation was whether to approve a withdrawal from the Endowment funds to address water management repairs and refinements to our property at 5007 Waterman Boulevard, including the following projects:

- * Replacement and modification of the Religious Education Roof
- * Replacement or repair of the West Flat Roof
- * Library Wall (exterior) repair
- * Gutter Replacement
- * Fellowship Hall Window Well Repair
- * Hosmer Room Bay repairs

* The motion that we withdraw \$150,000 from the Endowment funds to address water management repairs and refinements to our property resulted in a vote as follows: AYES: 73, including online and proxy votes. NAYS: None. MOTION CARRIED.
