Music Notes

J. S. Bach (1685-1750) did a great deal of text painting in this chorale prelude, which is about the baptism of Jesus. The two voices in the right hand represent the conversation between John the Baptist and Jesus; the left hand is the Jordan River flowing along at a spritely pace; and in the pedals we hear the chorale melody.

Louis-Nicolas Clérambault 1676–1749) was a French musician, best known as an organist and composer. He began as the organist at the church of the Grands-Augustins and entered the service of Madame de Maintenon. After the death of Louis XIV and Guillaume-Gabriel Nivers, he succeeded the latter at the organ of the church of Saint-Sulpice and the royal house of Saint-Cyr, an institution for young girls from the poor nobility. In 1719 he succeeded his teacher André Raison at the organs of the church of the Grands-Jacobins.
