#### First Unitarian Church of St Louis Policy Board Meeting Summary November 25, 2023 Virtual

The Policy Board unanimously adopted a recommendation from the Personnel Committee authorizing a new policy for paid vacation for all part-time staff who regularly work at least 10 hours per week. This new policy reflects our values to support our staff and all workers. Now, full-time and these part-time staff are entitled to paid vacation time.

We are looking for church members to join the Nominating Committee chaired by Margaret Weck. Serving on the Nominating Committee is a great way to learn more about all that is happening at First U. The Nominating Committee's busy time is from January to early May. Please let a board member or Margaret know if you may be interested. Please say yes if we approach you to invite you to join the committee!

The board enthusiastically agreed to ask the congregation to vote at the Mid-Winter Meeting to co-ordain (along with the Columbia, MO UU Church) George Grimm-Howell as a UU minister. The ordination ceremony will be held at First U STL in June. Congratulations to George for being accepted into preliminary fellowship pending completion of his internship.

The board continued to discuss creating a process for First U to take a public stand on social justice issues. The board minutes provide a summary of the UUA guide, Taking Action as a Congregation, Guide to Congregational Resolutions & Social Justice Statements, available at https://www.uua.org/justice-programs/resolutions.

The board approved sending letters to seven members we have not heard from in two years. At this time each year, First U sends letters to members whom we have lost touch with to see if they would like to remain members. We discussed how important it is to stay in touch and reach out to people we have not seen in a while.
