Music Notes

This prelude is often referred to by its time signature. 9/8 (three beats per measure, each divided into three eighth notes). The first four measures of the manual and the opening statement of the pedal part contain all the thematic material that Bach needed for four pages. The fugue is incredibly well crafted, with over fifty statements of the motive. It begins normally, and then turns the theme upside down for the next section. Next the regular and inverted themes are used together, and finally the pedal comes in with note values doubled (augmentation) to bring the fugue to a glorious conclusion.
