The mission of the Southside Early Childhood Center is to create lasting opportunities in the lives of our children—and their families—by providing the best in early childhood education and support services. Their mission is put into action through the four pillars of education, health, connection, and advocacy. In 1886, a group of Unitarian women created the first "day nursery," or child care center, west of the Mississippi River to ease the burden of childcare for immigrant families. Today, that historic organization is called SouthSide Early Childhood Center. It is an invaluable resource for St Louis City children and their parents offering quality education and enrichment opportunities to a diverse group of children across socio-economic, racial and cultural backgrounds.
