First Church Community Fund 2021 Awards

On Sunday October 17th, the First Church Community Fund (FCCF) committee announced 2021 nonprofit microgrant awards. The grants are possible through income from a First Church endowment created more than 30 years ago by the late Renni Shuter, a First Church member and St. Louis activist, and the ongoing generosity of First Church members and friends. Grants support programs and projects addressing issues surrounding homelessness, poverty and/or underserved populations in St. Louis.

The FCCF committee selected fifteen nonprofits from twenty-five applicants to receive a portion of the \$7400 in available funds this year. Individual grants ranged from \$300-\$750 and, with one exception, matched requests.

All microgrant recipients are doing important work in our community. The FCCF committee invites you to take a moment to learn about their mission and challenges and consider becoming involved if time and resources permit.

- Crime Victim Center (supportvictims.org) Steering wheel and gun locks for crime victims
- Energy Care (energycare.org) Purchase and installation of air conditioners for vulnerable seniors
- Gateway 180 (gateway180.org) Purchase of undergarments and clothing essentials for shelter clients
- **Healing Action Network (healingaction.org)** Emergency hotel stays and transportation for victims of sex trafficking
- Immigrant Home English Learning Program (ihelpstl.org) Educational supplies for its language outreach to isolated and under-resourced immigrants
- Joe's Place (joesplacestl.org) Dryer purchase for its group home for homeless teens
- Lift for Life Gym (lifegym.org) Support for its After-School programming for North City vouth
- Love for St. Louis (loveforstlouis.org) Payment of co pays to ensure children and teens receive needed counseling
- Northside Youth and Senior Services (nsyssc.org) Diaper supplies to families served through its programming
