Target St. Louis Film Viewing and Discussion with the Director

February 6th, 2026 - 6:45 pm

Damien D. Smith's award-winning film Target St. Louis documenting the military's experiments on an unknowing population at the Pruitt-Igoe Complex will be shown in the Chapel of First Unitarian Church on Feb. 6th at 6:45 pm.

The film will be followed by a panel discussion featuring Smith, Ben Phillips and Chester Deanes, plaintiffs in a class action suit seeking damages from Stanford University for the experimentation. Also participating virtually will be Lisa Martino Taylor, a researcher who uncovered key details about the tests.

Phillips and Deanes are leading an effort to introduce a bill in the Missouri Legislature that would demand access to records that will help the community better understand the impact the experiments had on the residents' health. They also will be calling for action from the region's congressional delegation, including Sens. Josh Hawley and Eric Schmidt and U.S. Rep. Wesley Bell.

To date Taylor's research shows the government sprayed zinc cadmium sulfide, a potential carcinogen, into the air as part of a Cold-War era experiment. Residents were unaware of what the government and its contractor, Stanford University, were up to and had no say in how the work was done. Many families say that in subsequent years their loved ones suffered from cancer and other maladies that caused deformities.

Policy Board Meeting Summary

January 12, 2026

The Policy Board voted to endorse a draft of a Land Acknowledgement Statement and Project for the congregation. Member Chris Tighe explained how, following a suggestion by the Worship Committee, the Social Justice Committee developed the proposal for a Native People's Acknowledgement Statement. The purpose of the Statement and Project is not just to acknowledge the harms that happened in the past, but the harms that are happening today.

The Social Justice Committee presented the draft Land Acknowledgement Statement and the other elements of the Project at the Mid-Winter Meeting. Over the next few months, there will be additional opportunities for the congregation to learn about the proposal, ask questions, and make suggestions. If there appears to be congregational support, the finalized Statement and Project proposal will be put to a Congregational vote at the May Annual Meeting.

The Board also discussed developing a 3-year rolling strategy rather than a 5- or 10-year strategic plan. The world is changing quickly, and we need to respond to an ever-changing environment. It is the Board's responsibility to create the rolling strategy, evaluate our performance, and update it annually. Our committees and staff will implement the plan. The Board will seek input from members and committees as they prepare our first 3-year rolling plan for kick-off in the 2026-2027 church year.

Thank You for Your Generosity!

Totals for our Designated Collection program are particularly strong so far this year with slightly over \$10,000 donated. In recent years, full year totals ranged from \$12-\$16,000.

The Facility committee request for monies for replacement trees received the highest single donation (\$1623.84), followed by the First Church Community Fund (\$1551.37), Central West End Homeless Outreach (\$1499.70) and St. Louis Foodbank (\$959.57).
