Sunday October 20th Designated Collection-The First Church Community Fund

Our Designated Collection this Sunday benefits the First Church Community Fund (FCCF), a church endowment established almost forty years ago to encourage our congregation's involvement in social action in our community. Income from the Fund supports microgrants to nonprofits addressing issues of homelessness, poverty, and marginalized populations in St. Louis. During Sunday's service, our 2024 grant recipients will be announced; they are a diverse group, but all share a common goal of making our community stronger and more equitable. Following our church service, representatives from this year's grant recipients will be on hand for an informal "Meet and Greet" opportunity beginning at 11 am in Fellowship Hall.

FCCF grants are one of several ways in which we as a congregation live our mission and values in our community. They supplement nonprofits' operating budgets by enabling special projects or programs, filling emergency needs, or leveraging additional donations.

All donations in Sunday's plate collection (cash & checks) will go to the Fund, as well as donations made via "Text to Give", or by using the QR code for online giving (found on the pew card for giving in the Sanctuary). Donations to the Fund are also gratefully received at any time throughout the year. They can be a great way to celebrate achievements and milestones in a meaningful way for that person who has everything!

Otherwise, simply gather the courage to speak from your heart, and let the others know that you are feeling sad and carrying grief in your body. First Unitarian Church of St. Louis Policy Board Meeting Summary September 16, 2024 Virtual

The Board spent most of this meeting discussing and agreeing that First U should begin developing a vision statement that incorporates our mission and values. A vision statement is aspirational, looking to the future, and grows out of our mission statement.

Board members agreed that developing a First U vision statement would be healthy and positive, generate enthusiasm, and help members envision a future church. We need to visualize what is next for us as a church and what we are working towards. We have already adopted the phrase "inspire, imagine, invest" to describe this church year, and that phrase also describes the goals of a visioning process.
